Review Criteria for NH-LIFT CATALYST Seed Grant Funding Proposals

Seed Catalyst Funding Eligibility

- 1. A NH-LIFT Partner Institution
- 2. Proposals must include a PUI or Community College, preferably as the PI
- 3. A faculty member may lead only one project but can be a collaborator on another within a funding cycle.
- 4. The proposal must demonstrate an understanding of the distinct differences between Collaborative and Catalyst funding.

NSF Ranking: 1 = Poor; 2 = Fair; 3 = Good; 4 = Very Good; 5 = Excellent

PROPOSAL ALIGNMENT WITH LIFT GOALS

Collaboration and Ecosystem Strengthening

- The proposal fosters a cross-institutional research ecosystem by building relationships that include two or more academic institutions.
- The proposal creates an environment of reciprocal collaboration
- The proposal aligns with the <u>NH Research and Industry Plan</u>. This criteria is not required but could be a deciding factor with funding is limited

Inclusion of PUI/Community College Faculty

- The proposal includes two or more collaborators and aligns with NH-LIFT's aim to broaden the participation of PUIs and/or Community Colleges.
- The project team includes a faculty member from a PUI and/or Community College.
- The proposal includes an early career faculty member.

PROJECT DESIGN AND APPROACH

Clarity and Feasibility of Activities and Graduate Student Involvement

- The proposed activities are clearly defined, with a well articulated and feasible timeline.
- Graduate student engagement enhances collaborative research efforts. Examples include data collection and pilot studies, providing publication or grant writing support, facilitating collaborative research, etc.
- The role of the graduate student is clearly defined
- The graduate student will be mentored by a faculty member who is a part of a collaborative team.

BUDGET AND RESOURCES

Reasonableness and Justification of Budget

- The budget is reasonable and justified for the proposed activities.
- Requested funds are appropriately allocated.
